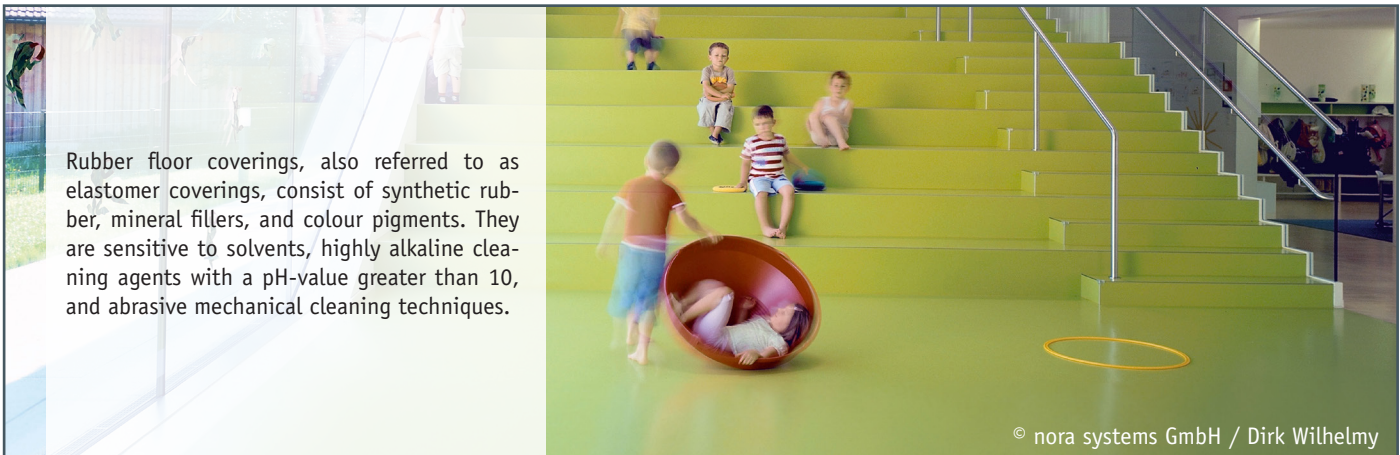

RUBBER FLOOR COVERINGS IN SPORTS AND MULTI-PURPOSE HALLS



Rubber floor coverings, also referred to as elastomer coverings, consist of synthetic rubber, mineral fillers, and colour pigments. They are sensitive to solvents, highly alkaline cleaning agents with a pH-value greater than 10, and abrasive mechanical cleaning techniques.

CLEANING

DEEP CLEANING

	Dirt	Treatment	Cleaning device
Pick up loose dirt, and remove any mortar, plaster residue, and colour stains manually using a scraper.	RESIDUE FROM CARE PRODUCTS	Apply the cleaning solution evenly over the floor, and leave it to work for approximately 10 to 15 minutes. <i>PLEASE NOTE: Do not allow the cleaning solution to dry.</i>	
	in the form of residual coatings can be removed using Corridor® Unic Ultra S 707, Corridor® Power Stripper S 708 or Planta® Multi Stripper P 321.	Deep clean the floor covering using a single-disc machine and a red pad.	
		Pick up the loosened dirt using a wet vacuum cleaner, and rinse with water.	

INTENSIVE CLEANING

Pick up loose dirt, and remove any mortar, plaster residue, and colour stains manually using a scraper.	HEAVIER DIRT THAT IS ALKALINE-SOLUBLE	Apply the cleaning solution evenly over the floor, and leave it to work for a short time.	
	like, protein, oil and grease or foodstuff residue e.g. coffee, red wine etc. can be removed by intensive cleaning using Maradin HC 43 (corresponds to DIN 18032/2).	Clean using a single-disc machine and a red pad.	
		Pick up the loosened dirt using a wet vacuum cleaner, and rinse with water.

SPECIAL CLEANING

	Dirt	Treatment	Cleaning device
<p>Pick up loose dirt, and remove any mortar, plaster residue, and colour stains manually using a scraper.</p>	<p>REMOVING RUBBER ABRASION</p> <p>is easy with the solvent-containing Indu-master® Forte IR 42 cleaner diluted 1:1.</p> <p><i>PLEASE NOTE: Perform a material compatibility test before use!</i></p>	<p>Spray the product onto targeted areas.</p>

<p>Because paraffin-like age inhibitors in the rubber floor covering may impair coating adhesion over time, rubber floor coverings in sports halls should not be coated.</p>	<p>INITIAL TREATMENT WITH WIPE CARE PRODUCTS</p> <p>The use of the polymer-based wipe care product CORRIDOR® DAILY S 780 is recommended as an alternative way to protect the floor covering.</p>	<p>Wet and wipe the floor covering, and leave it to dry.</p>	
		<p>Polish the floor covering using a high-speed machine and a suitable pad.</p>
